 - Jan 3 Bought inventory worth TK15, 000 on credit.
 - Jan 4 Paid TK5, 000 for rent.
 - Jan 5 Provided services to a client for TK12, 000, receiving TK8, 000 in cash and the rest on credit.

- Jan 7 Returned Tk3, 000 worth of defective inventory to the supplier before payment.
- Jan 10 Collected Tk20, 000 from customers within the discount period.
- Jan 12 Paid supplier within the discount period for remaining inventory purchases.
- Jan 15 Purchased additional inventory worth Tk10, 000 on cash.
- Jan 20 Paid Tk1, 200 for store rent and Tk500 for utilities.
- Jan 23 A customer returned merchandise sold earlier that had a selling price of Tk2, 000 and cost Tk1, 000.
- Jan 25 Counted ending inventory and found it to be Tk16, 500.

Protesters demanded the resignation of the whole administration on August 3, 2024, rejecting Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's request for talks. At a large protest in Central Shaheed Minar in Dhaka, Nahid Islam, a well-known coordinator of the Anti-Discriminatory Student Movement, said, "We call for a student uprising and reject the current government and its fascist regime." Our sole demands are for Sheikh Hasina to quit and for fascism to cease to achieve our goal of an autocracy-free Bangladesh.

While the government says that Ganabhaban's doors are open for negotiations, Nahid added, "Sheikh Hasina knows those doors should remain open because we demand her resignation along with the entire cabinet." In addition to her resignation, she needs to answer for the murders and abductions that have afflicted the nation. Claiming that the government is responsible for enforced disappearances and deaths, student leaders made it plain that they no longer want justice from it. "How can those guilty of these crimes bring about justice? This dictatorship is not going to provide justice for these crimes. At the same time, people are being tortured, killed, kidnapped, and detained, Nahid claimed.

Under the Anti-Discriminatory Student Movement title, the students declared intentions to present a united front that would unite professionals, student organizations, and residents. They called on the populace to join the unplanned rebellion spreading throughout communities. The protestors formed a cohesive group called 'Jatiya Sangram Parishad' and planned national sit-ins and marches. They also issued a 24-hour ultimatum, asking that all university campuses and dorms be reopened and threatening to enter the halls if their demand was not satisfied physically.
